

FROGGS Goals

The overall mission of FROGGS is to promote, care for, and fund greenways in Pitt County and the City of Greenville.

1. Ensure and advocate for safe and clean greenways.

- a. Fundraise for and install safety features along the greenway system such as flashing beacons, wayfinding markers, signage, bollards.
- b. Host regular clean-ups of areas adjacent to or near greenways.
- c. Provide support to community groups interested in holding their own cleanups, maintenance, or gardening.

2. Promote expansion of greenways throughout Pitt County.

- a. Advocate for Greenville and Pitt County governments to coordinate planning for recreational trails, bikeways, greenways, linear parks, conservation easements, and utility easements with the purpose of developing a county-wide interconnected system of linear parks.
- b. Identify and apply for funding to construct new greenway systems.
- c. Work with stakeholder groups (such as city, university, and private owners) to identify priority greenway connectors.
- d. Partner, encourage, and assist any efforts across broader Pitt County to encourage greenway development.

3. Add, inventory, and maintain amenities along the greenways.

- a. Amenities include, among other items: benches, picnic tables, kiosks, information signs, shelters, water fountains, trash cans, trees, bicycle repair stations, and exercise equipment.
- b. Solicit and support amenity ideas from the public or other community groups, including those that may have programs with parallel goals, e.g., Re-Leaf, Greenville Recreation and Parks, and ECU Sustainability organizations.
- c. Create a standard for amenities, e.g., standard distance between benches.
